You probably know“hello”and“How are you?”in English. But English speakers use many

other greeting words. Let’s learn some of them.

Formal(正式的) greetings	
It’s best to use them when you talk to someone for the first time. You can use them to show respect. You can also use them at formal events.	“ Good morning/afternoon/eve-ning.”are formal greetings.“It’s nice to meet you.”is formal too. Remember to only use it the first time you meet some- one.“How are you doing?”and“How do you do?”are also formal greetings.
Informal(非正式) greetings	
When it comes to a talk with friends, family members or someone you know, you can use informal greetings.	“Hi”, “Hey”, “Morning”, “Nice to meet you.”“What’s up?”, “How is it going?”, “ How ’s everything?” and “How’s your day?”are popular ones.
Slang(俚语) greetings	

<p>They are very informal. So you should only use them with people you know very well. A lot of slang is regional.</p> <p>For example, if you use Australian slang in the US. Americans may feel strange and can't understand.</p>	<p>“Yo”is common in the US. You should only use it with very close friends.“Are you OK?” and “You alright?”are common in Britain.“G'day, mate!”is common in Australia. It's the same as“Good day”.“Howdy!”is common in some parts of Canada and the US. And it's the same as“How do you do?”.</p>
