Assessment and diagnosis



Collecting patient information

Nurses evaluate which implemented interventions are achieving the desired outcomes




Collecting feedback from patients

Based on the evaluations and feedback, nurses identify areas for improvement and make necessary changes to enhance the quality of care provided






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Communication skills in English nursing procedures





Principles of cross cultural communication



Respect for cultural differences

Recognize and examine the unique cultural backgrounds and beliefs of patients

Patient centered approach

Tailor communication strategies to meet the needs and preferences of individual patients

Use of clear and simple language

Avoid complex medical jargon and use plain language to facilitate understanding

Cultural sensitivity and awareness

Be aware of cultural differences in communication styles and adapt accordingly





Effective communication skills and methods



Activelistening

Give patients the opportunity to express their concerns and listen attentively to their needs



Use of open ended questions

Encourage patients to share more information by asking open ended questions




Nonverbal communication
