

>>> Is the Clean Hong Kong campaign(运动)working?

LittleBug 88:	My dad had to pay a \$1500 fine today for throwing a cigarette butt on the ground. An officer caught him and gave him a ticket. That's just bad!
MsNeat99:	Littering is against the law. If you break that law, you're a "littler bug", and have to pay the fine. You

	bring that onto yourself! The law is there to <u>deter</u> people from littering and to keep our environment clean.

TidyBunny:	What's the Clean Hong Kong campaign?
MsNeat99:	The government started it to make Hong Kong cleaner.  It's now illegal to litter or spit in public places. The campaign includes posters and television advertisements to educate people about the law and encourage them to keep Hong Kong clean.
TidyBunny:	I think the campaign is a great idea. I always pick up after myself and try to keep all public places clean.
MsNeat99:	I really support this campaign too. It's important to keep our public spaces clean, otherwise diseases can spread quickly, and we can get very sick.
LittleBug 88:	I know a clean environment is important, but the campaign just isn't effective. After all, people still litter and spit in public spaces.
TidyBunny:	If you aren't worried about the fine, then you'll litter. But as long as some people are worried about the fine, they won't litter. The fine works if it prevents some people from making public spaces dirty.



Green Kids Cook: Simple, Delicious Recipes & Top Tips




