When 23-year-old Eric Atienza graduated from college last year, he didn't have a job. Not

wanting to give up his department and move back with his parents, he did what many young Americans are doing: he signed up with a temp agency, which places workers on short-term jobs. Temporary workers such as Atienza make up 20 percent of the US workforce. In 1985,417,000 workers were classified as temporary help. In 2021, there are more than 2.5 million, according to Labor Department data.

Using temporary workers allows companies to increase or decrease the number of staff as their workloads change. It also allows the companies to avoid the costs involved in hiring and firing long-term employees.

Many temp agency owners and career specialists say temping is a good way for recent graduates to get experience. "Short-term jobs let the graduates try out different companies to find the best fit." said Pegi Wheatley, owner of McCall staffing, a San Francisco temp agency.

But things don't always work out that way. "When I started temping, I had this idea that a temporary job could turn full time. It worked for a friend of mine, but that didn't happen for me." said Atienza, who quickly became bored with his office work. Atienza stayed with the temp agency because he could earn US\$10 an hour doing office work. Other short-term jobs, such as working as a store clerk or in a café, pay about US\$7.

But there were trade-offs for the higher pay. Because in the US, health insurance is provided

through employer, most temps are not suitable for workplace benefits. Atienza ran the risk that

an accident or illness would land him in hospital with no ways to pay the bill. Other drawbacks,

though less serious, still mean that temping for most graduates is exactly what its name

implies—a temporary choice. Instability(不稳定), gaps between contracts, lack of vacation time

and isolation  $(\underline{M}\dot{\underline{\tau}})$  from other employees are often negatives.

"Temping gives the time to figure out what I wanted to do, because I could pay off my bills.

But none of that came from the jobs themselves. " said Atienza who quit temping last month in favor of a full time job.

Ray Fisman, a Columbia University economics professor, conducted a two-year study on

Americans' dating preferences. "Men prefer women whom they rate as smarter, but only up to a

told the New York Times. "It turns out that men avoid women whom they perceive(发觉) to be smarter than themselves. The same hold true for measures of career ambition: A woman could be ambitious, just not more ambitious than the man considering her for a date."

This perceived bias(偏见) by some men against strong, successful women extends to other parts of social life, including politics. For instance, Hillary Clinton must face these bias as a presidential candidate(候选人).

The former First Lady appears in public wearing business suits and talking about national and international issues with a lawyer's cool mind and sharp tongue. However, while her rival Barack Obama gets "fired up", in the words of his fall campaign slogan, Hillary(希拉里) is careful to remain calm. She often says that she likes the kitchen, perhaps knowing that some may be uncomfortable electing a strong female president who doesn't exhibit at least some of the more traditional "female" features.

According to the New York Times, women earning high salaries can also embarrass their male friends. For the first time, women in their 20s who work full time in several American cities -New York, Chicago, Boston and Minneapolis -are earning higher wages than men in the same age range. The new income superiority(优势) of young women is bringing them "forms of hostility(敌对) they weren't prepared to meet", Beveridge told the New York Times.
