People in many cultures love theatre. One of the oldest and greatest storytelling \_\_\_\_32\_\_\_\_ in the world can be seen in theatres in Indonesia. It is a kind of *shadow puppet show* (皮影戏) called *Wayang Kulit*. *Wayang* is a kind of leather and *kulit* \_\_\_\_33\_\_\_\_ puppet.

In a *Wayang Kulit* show, the stage and the equipment are quite simple—not like \_\_\_\_34\_\_\_\_ theatres! There are puppets, musicians, a puppeteer and a screen made from a white sheet.

*Wayang Kulit* puppets are flat and made of leather, and they come in big and small sizes. They have different eyes, noses and mouths, so they all look very different—just like people! For each show, there is only one puppeteer. He

show! This is a very special job and it is not easy. Good puppeteers are very 37 in Indonesia, and sometimes more than 6,000 people come to see the show.

In a *Wayang Kulit* show, the puppeteer sits behind a white screen. A lamp or light is shone onto the screen, so the puppets look like dark shadows. Each puppet has three sticks attached to it: one on the body and one on each arm. The puppeteer moves the puppet with these sticks. Usually, good characters 38 on the right side of the screen, and bad characters on the left side.

One of the most amazing things about the *Wayang Kulit*, is that a show can 39 all night, even up to ten hours! The puppeteer and musicians are going to be tired after each show!



**Intelligent animals** Scientists used to believe that animals could not think, but now we know that animals can understand information and use it. 61, if we repeat words such as *Down* or *Sit* to dogs, they'll begin to understand them and follow the instruction. Some kinds of dogs can understand more than one hundred words!

Some dogs have jobs. Working dogs are 62 good at learning words because they have to listen carefully to instructions. Border collies, a kind of dog, are often used to move sheep. Farmers use special words to tell the dogs what to do. They say *Find* when they want the dog to go and look for the sheep, and then *Walk* when they want the dog to move towards the sheep. The dogs also need to understand the word *Stop*. They can also understand if they have done a job well and 63 whether the command is from their own farmer.

Dogs are not the only creatures that can learn words. An orca (killer whale) called Wilkie has been taught to repeat the words Hello and Bye-bye and can count to three. She produces the sounds by pushing air through her blowhole, but amazingly, she can 64 the sound of a human voice. If she listens to children, she sounds like a child when she repeats the words. In the wild, orcas live in groups and the young orcas make the similar sounds to the sounds the adult orcas make. So, each group of orcas 65 from other groups.

Parrots are famous for repeating words, and an African Grey parrot called Alex could understand the English words for one hundred and fifty different things—like *water*, *banana* and *grape*. He knew some colours and shapes, and he could count various items. He could



even understand the word *none* or *zero*. People once thought it was 66 to say someone had a brain like a bird, but now it seems birds and other animals are smarter than we thought.

#### AN ANCIENT MURDER<sup>[1]</sup>

In 1991, hikers in the Italian Alps discovered a body frozen in ice in Ötzi. They were surprised to learn that it belonged to a man who died 5,300 years ago! This was the o67 complete human body ever found.

Scientists named the man Ötzi after the p68 he was found. They studied his body and learned many things. His teeth and **skull**<sup>[2]</sup> showed that he was probably in his 40s. He wore thick clothes and shoes made of bear skin. He carried a stone knife, wooden arrows, and equipment for starting fires. And he had a **copper axe**<sup>[3]</sup>—a rare and valuable t69 back when Ötzi was alive.

#### The Plot Thickens

Most interestingly, there were injuries on Ötzi's body that showed he was a 70. There was a piece from a stone arrow buried deep in his left shoulder. Scientists believe this is what killed him. There was also the blood of four other people on his clothes, as well as injuries on his hands. These injuries were not c71 **healed**<sup>[4]</sup>—they were recent, but

not as recent as the injury on his shoulder.

Ötzi's story quickly became a murder **mystery**<sup>[5]</sup>—the world's earliest murder mystery. Why was he killed? Was he running away when he died? And why was he even there, in such a cold and faraway place? New studies in 2010 and 2018 revealed more clues.

### New Findings

Scientists learned that Ötzi ate a big m<sup>72</sup> right before he died—they found goat and deer meat in his stomach. He was therefore probably resting, not running, when he died. They also learned that the arrow in Ötzi's shoulder hit him from behind.

Did someone injure Ötzi in a fight, and did Ötzi run up the mountain to e<sup>73</sup>? Did that same person follow Ötzi up the mountain and shoot him in the back? It's a good theory, but scientists will probably never completely know how or why Ötzi died.

Natalie Hampton from California, USA, knows what it feels like to be alone at a new school. She found it difficult to make new friends and had to search for a new table at lunch every day. Natalie is pleased with the way people are responding to her app—especially those who suffer from **bullying**<sup>[3]</sup>. Soon after the **launch**<sup>[4]</sup> of her app, she won an award for it. She also appeared in many news stories.

Natalie was even asked to speak at a United Nations Youth **Assembly**<sup>[5]</sup>. In her talk, Natalie wanted people to know that you don't have to do something big to change lives. Sometimes, a simple thing—like having a friend to enjoy lunch with—can make all the difference.
