# Type 1: Formal

1. Formal words are those used by educated people in formal contexts: thesis writing, official news releases, and formal announcement.
2. “gentlemen” vs. “men” or “guys”.

# Type 2: General

1. General words form the basis of the vocabulary and are used for everyday communication.
  - **Poor---**
