If you're a fan of ships, don't miss China's first home-grown large cruise ship (邮轮)—
"Adora Magic City". The ship is 323.6 meters long, with 135,500 GT tons. It has the beauty of both traditional Chinese art and the Western style.

It can carry up to 5,246 passengers and provides them with rich and colorful activities. It has 16 floors and a total of 40,000 square meters of public living and relaxing space. People can shop at a large duty-free (免税) store on the cruise ship. It's around 2,000 square meters in size. People on the ship will also enjoy movies and special food. There is even a kids' playground with some water-play things and a big area for children to enjoy the sunshine.

The Adora Magic City began its first trip on January 1, 2024 and the trip lasted for seven days and six nights. The ship traveled 1,119 nautical miles, carrying more than 3,000 passengers. Longer lines will be planned in the future. "We expect the ship to become 'a floating (漂浮的) name card at sea'," said a Chinese government officer.

The Ancient Tea Horse Road can date back to the Han Dynasty. It then continued developing in the Tang, Song, Yuan, Ming and Qing dynasties. There were two main roads. One began in Sichuan province. The other began in Yunnan province. Each one ended in Tibet (西藏).

People in Tibet have a tea history of about 1,000 years. The weather in Tibet is dry and cold. People there need to eat a lot and keep warm. Tea can help them digest (消化). But tea can't grow in Tibet. They used to sell their horses for tea. So tea and horses were traded through the Ancient Tea Horse Road.

In the past, horses carried bags of tea from Yunnan to Tibet. The trip took more than two months. In Sichuan, the road was very difficult for horses. So only people carried bags of tea. And each young worker carried 15 bags of tea. Each bag weighed 10 kg.

The Ancient Tea Horse Road not only served as a trading road, but also a bridge connecting different nationalities (民族)—such as Han and Tibetan people.

Are you an "E person" or an "I person"? These two personality labels (个性标签) are widely discussed online. They are part of a popular personality test called the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator, or MBTI. There are 16 results in total of the test.

Usually, an "I person" is quiet, while an "E person" is outgoing. But an "I person" can still act outgoing sometimes. For example, when an "I person" is with a group of "I" friends, they might want to change and become more social like an "E person".

According to psychologists (心理家), this idea of personality changing is called "masking" (伪装). That is hiding your true personality in certain situations. "Humans want to be welcomed, and they might change their personalities within a short time," wrote the Master Class website.

Using the MBTI result to describe someone's personality seems fun. However, I realized I was deeply influenced by the result once. My sister was excitedly making a travel plan. But I remembered from an article that a "P person" doesn't like to make or follow plans. So I said to her, "You don't seem like a 'P person'." "Why?" She asked back. "Because the personality test tells a 'P person' doesn't like to make plans!" At that moment, I realized I'd taken the result too seriously.

The MBTI personality test may show something you don't know about yourself. And it can even be a fun way to start a conversation when meeting new friends. And that's all for fun. Knowing someone's MBTI result doesn't mean you really know this person. And those results of yours don't define (定义) who you are.

Xinzhai, a village of Baoshan city in Yunnan Province, is one of the earliest places to produce coffee in China. The proper temperature and soil make it a great place for growing high-quality (高质量的) coffee plants.

Villagers in Xinzhai began to plant coffee trees in 1952. But the Chinese people were not yet used to drinking coffee. As a result, the villagers ended up growing rice and corn instead. In the 1980s, when international coffee brands were introduced to China, the villagers began to plant coffee trees again. However, these international companies only bought low-quality coffee beans from Xinzhai to make cheap instant coffee (速溶咖啡). So it was hard for the villagers to make money.

Since 2007, Xinzhai village has been improving their coffee industry. High-quality coffee plants were chosen to produce high-quality coffee. The village also developed its own coffee brand. Today, the coffee growing area here is over 9 million square meters. The "Baoshan coffee" has won many international prizes and is sold all over the world.

Xinzhai village has also been developing local tourism. The Coffee Experience Hall, the Coffee Museum, and some farmhouses were built. Every year, about 120,000 come to Xinzhai. When visiting here, they can pick coffee beans, learn how to make coffee and taste the fresh and high-quality coffee.



Are you good at cooking? Recently, a 10-year-old girl called Sun Jiarui got tons of attention online for her amazing cooking skills.

Sun Jiarui's father is the cook and owner of a farm restaurant in Wuxi, Jiangsu Province. Sun Jiarui started helping out with chores when she was around 4 or 5. When she was 8, she asked her father to teach her to cook after school. Now she can cook more than 50 dishes, which is not easy—even for an adult. "It's <u>beneficial</u> for her to know some life skills so that she can better take care of herself when she grows up," says Sun Jiarui's father.

Her school has also set up a new cooking course for her. And Jiarui is a teacher in the cooking class. She teaches other students to make simple dishes there. "It was out of curiosity (好奇) at first, but finally, I enjoyed cooking. I hope that the course will help us to learn basic life skills. Then we can share housework with our parents," says Jiarui.

Her school is not the only one to open a cooking course in China. Actually, in September last year, primary and middle school students in China found a new "practical activities" course in their school timetable, with at least one class every week. The new course has three kinds of tasks: everyday chores, productive labor (生产劳动) and volunteer work. Quite a lot of people welcome such courses.

Honeybees (蜜蜂) are great dancers, but they don't just dance for fun. Dancing is also their way of communicating. The bee dance is called the "waggle dance" (摇摆舞).

Waggle dance helps bees find food. If a bee finds something to eat, it will start dancing. First, the bee's position shows other bees which way to go. Second, if the bee shakes a lot, that means the food is far away. Less shaking means the food is closer. Third, if the bee dances for a long time, it means the food is very delicious.

A research team studied honeybee dance moves. The scientists are from the Xishuangbanna Tropical Botanical Garden of the Chinese Academy of Sciences(中国科学院西双版纳热带植物园). They found out how bees learn the waggle dance. Young bees learn from older bees.

The scientists recorded videos of bees in a laboratory. Then they compared two groups of young bees. The bees were only 10 days old. In one group, young bees could watch older ones dance. These young bees became good dancers. In the other group, young bees could not watch older dancers. These young bees could not dance as well as the first group.

This study changed how scientists think about bees. They used to think all bees could do the
