Definition of Public Health Care

Public Health Care is a system designed to promote and protect the health of the entire population, compared to individuals It focuses on prevention and controlling the spread of diseases, promoting health behaviors, and ensuring access to basic health services

It aims to identify and address the social, environmental, and behavioral factors that impact the health of communities, rather than just treating individual symptoms or diseases

Events and controls the spread of diseases through vacuum programs, screening programs, and awareness campaigns
